

**Child Care and Development Fund**

## **Caseload**

- 4,640 children were served this month in this program
- 2,971 families received subsidies for childcare through this program
- 8.9% of the families entered the program during this period
- Yellowstone County accounted for 25.9% of all families served

## **Children**

- 92.8% of children were served in licensed care
- 5.4% of children were cared for by relatives
- Children under 1 year of age were in child care an average of 117 hours per month
- School-age children (ages 6 and older) constitute 26.0% of all children served
- White children accounted for 80.7% of all children served

## **Families**

- 72.7% of families received subsidies because of employment
- 100.0% of families had copayments, at an average of 4.0% of income
- The average number of children served per family was 1.7
- 88.8% of families were headed by a single parent
- 12.2% of families listed TANF as a source of income

## **Expenditures**

- The average cost of care this month per child was \$437 (monthly subsidy + parent fee)
- Parents paid 8.0% of the cost and the program paid 92.0%
- Average monthly expenditures for children under 1 year of age was \$479
- Average monthly expenditures for school-age children (ages 6 and older) was \$311
- 81.5% of total expenditures were for children under 6 years of age

## **Counties**

- The highest average cost of care was in Judith Basin County at \$780 per child
  
- Judith Basin County ranks first in relative care statewide with 100.0% of all children cared for by relatives.
  
- The county with the greatest percent of TANF recipients in the caseload was Musselshell County, where 42.9% of families receiving child care subsidies also received income from TANF
